<u>Community Emergency Plan</u>: Mr Martin Rich, from Devon Communities Together, attended the July meeting and spoke about the benefits of having a Community Emergency Plan in place. After discussion it was agreed that a draft plan should be drawn up and that such a plan should involve members of the public. If you are interested in being part of this project, or knowing more about it, please contact the Clerk.

<u>Climate Emergency Plan</u>: Following discussion it was resolved to look into this matter further and to make enquiries regarding plans already in place, or being considered, in the surrounding area.

<u>Helicopter Night Landing Site</u>: Arrangements for an 'Opening Ceremony' will be finalised at the September meeting. Watch out for posters advertising the event.

Public Footpaths: A report detailing the up to date position on our local public footpaths is now available and a copy can be obtained from the Clerk.

<u>New Cemetery/Geophysical Survey/Community Dig</u>: 50 members of the public attended the public open meeting, on 16^{th} July, to receive feedback from the recently completed Geophysical Survey. The Survey had uncovered several areas of interest which would be investigated further. The 'Community Dig', on the proposed new Cemetery site off Dark Lane, is planned for the $18^{th} - 28^{th}$ September 2019 and anyone interested in being part of this who has yet to register with the Clerk is asked to do so as soon as possible. The Parish Council is pleased to announce that Vanita Eden will take on the role of Community Dig Project Evaluator.

<u>Job Vacancy – Handyperson</u>: Following the resignation of Colin, our village Handyman, the Parish Council has been advertising for someone else to take on this role. It is hoped that a new 'Handyperson' will be announced at the September meeting. Colin was thanked by the Parish Council for the hard work he has put in over the past three years in the role.

<u>Section 106 Funding and Church Commissioner business</u>: There is no further news, to date, to report regarding the purchase of the Sheep Dip or the purchase of land to create a pathway from Silver Street to the Millennium Field. Regarding the allotment field, however, the Church Commissioners had suggested that allotments will not now need to be dug up in order to lay underground electricity cables in connection with the proposed new housing development.

19/00543/HOUSE Erection of extension following removal of existing and erection of replacement garage/store at Stable Cottage, Thorverton. <u>Granted.</u>

18/01840/FULL Revised. Change of use of land for the siting of permanent and touring pitches for tents and caravans at Ruffwell Inn, Thorverton. <u>Granted.</u>

19/00755/HOUSE Erection of a detached timber garage/garden store at Station House, Thorverton. <u>Granted.</u>
