Re: Land at Thorverton

As you may be aware, every Council has to prepare a Local Plan which sets out a long term vision for their area, including identifying new development sites and Devon County Council recently ran a call for sites exercise.

The Church Commissioners support the delivery of new homes and employment opportunities on our landholdings. We aim to create high-quality communities that can support new and existing residents.

Land within the village has been identified as potentially suitable for residential development. Therefore, our planning consultants, have responded to the call for sites on our behalf to promote this land through the Local Plan process.


